ACI Developing Nations Airport Assistance Programme (DNA) "Terminal Operations" Incheon, Republic of Korea, 8-12 July 2013

The first ACI-DNA Assistance Seminar of 2013 in the Asia-Pacific Region was jointly organized with our colleagues ACI Asia-Pacific and the Incheon Airport Academy.

Unlike past DNA three-day seminar formats, the delegates - representing eight member airports—had the added benefit of participating in a 5-day intensive seminar this time around. Topics such as Terminal Planning and Design, Customer Service Strategy, Terminal Security Operations and Airport Environment Management were each covered by Incheon Airport Academy subject matter experts (totalling 9 instructors).

Prior to the course start, the students were expected to prepare a country report and a 15-minute presentation for the seminar, briefly summarizing their respective nations, organizations, and the status of terminal operations in their airports. This was definitely beneficial as it promoted what we believe to be a cornerstone of all our trainings—the exchange of knowledge and best practices!

It was not all hard work during the 5 day seminar. The participants were treated to a visit of Incheon's Terminal Facility Operations as well as a guided tour of Seoul where they were even able to participate in a Korean tea ceremony (or darye) in traditional dress! As many of the participants were able to attest, the opportunity to sneak a greater peek into our host country's culture definitely served to enrich the overall training experience for all.

On a final note, ACI would like to thank Ms. Song-yee Han, Global Training Team Manager and the dedicated team of professionals at Incheon International Airport who provided first rate support and facilities to the participants.

Wildlife Hazard Management Course Johannesburg, South Africa, 19-21 August 2013

If you were to ask most people the question - "Where in the world would be an ideal venue for hosting a Wildlife Hazard Management Course? The chances are they would say the continent of Africa and probably Johannesburg's O.R. Tambo International Airport.

It was therefore with great delight that we were invited as ACI instructors to deliver the Wildlife Hazard Management course at Airports Company South Africa's (ACSA) O.R. Tambo Airport in 19-21 August 2013.

Indeed, it soon became evident that other ACI member airports also had the same thought process, as within

arranged for the following week!

With delegates from airports in South Africa, Nigeria and Israel in attendance, the scene was set for a great course with plenty of discussion, exchange of views on new techniques and "best practice" being used to reduce the Wildlife Hazard at our airports.

The lead ACI Instructor for the course was Debbie Riley, who holds a degree in Animal Science and has implemented Wildlife Hazard Management Plans (WHMP) for airports in Europe, Middle East and Africa.

The Course opened with a review of Bird and Wildlife strikes at airports from around the world, highlighting the lessons learned and the importance of implementing customized WHMPs relevant to the airports environment and specific Wildlife threat.

The participants were then taught the principles of evaluating various wildlife risks (in accordance with the ACI Handbook and ICAO risk assessment processes). This was followed by a number of Group exercises to assess the wildlife hazards at an airport and implement appropriate mitigation. Further sessions followed on different Bird Scaring techniques, the importance of record keeping and analysis and how new technology is being added to the various "tools" used by airport Wildlife Management departments.

A highlight of the Course was a practical session on the airfield at O.R. Tambo with the Wildlife Team who were pleased to show the delegates how they have trained Springer Spaniel and Border Collie dogs to reduce the hazard at Africa's busiest airport. One could ask "how do you follow that?" Well the following day a live snake was brought into class and all the delegates got close up and personal to this beautiful yet potentially highly dangerous species. It is Africa after all!

On the final day of the course the delegates were treated to a number of fascinating Case Studies from airports around the world prior to participating in an intensive Aerodrome Safeguarding exercise which allowed them to put their weeks learning into practice.

ACI/ICAO Aerodrome Certification Course (AMPAP Elective)



In accordance with ICAO International Standards and Recommended Practices as detailed in Annex 14 and Doc 9774, all aerodromes should be certified by the State and licensed for use. This course explains the certification process applied by State regulators and exactly what aerodromes need to do, not only to become "certified" but to remain certified as traffic grows and the aerodrome expands for the future.

Airport Ground Handling Regulations and Slots



This overview course provides a clear and concise interpretation of the obligations that airports in the European Union are required to adhere regarding the organization and function of ground handling market and slots. The existing EU Law will be fully explained as well as the proposals of the European Commission on ground handling market and slots under the 4th airport package. Details of the most important changes on the function of the groundhandling and slots market will be provided and discussion of its consequences to the managing bodies of the airports and the slots coordinator will take place.
