Joel Morin has over 40 years of knowledge and experience in aviation, due to his extensive aviation career spanning military aerospace engineering, air traffic management, International Air Transport Association advocacy and support to ICAO. His expertise includes airport and airspace planning and optimisation; air navigation policy design and service planning.

Joel is currently managing director of aviation consultancy To70 Canada, part of the To70 Group of companies, with other offices in The Hague, Frankfurt, Geneva, Melbourne, Brisbane, Singapore, Shanghai, Bangkok, Mumbai, Sao Paolo and Medellin.

Prior to joining To70 Canada, Joel spent 5 years at IATA as Head, ATM Harmonization & Global Policy at IATA, helping to ensure the harmonized and cost-effective implementation of major ATM projects across the globe. At Nav Canada, Joel was responsible for the Area Control Centre in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, including subordinate control towers, flight information centres and flight service stations.

Over the past several years, Joel has been invited to lead or speak to a number of international ATM-related seminars and workshops around the world. He has also participated in most ATM-related ICAO expert panels, being involved in strategic discussions regarding airspace, traffic flows and contingency plans and drafting a few ICAO guidance material - most notably, as a principal co-author of ICAO Document 9971 (Manual on Collaborative Air Traffic Flow Management) pertaining to Collaborative Decision Making in general, Air Traffic Flow Management, and Airport Collaborative Decision Making (A-CDM)

Joel is also a member of ACI World's Safety and Technical Standing Committee and is part of the committee's working group on A-CDM.
